Why the name?

It is an Australian tradition among some social golfers to suffer memory lapses when relaying recent good form to the handicapper. In reality, there is a bushranger at every social golf event - someone who wants to win at all costs and is prepared to sell his soul to pick up that coveted gift voucher, dozen balls or shiny silver tankard!

The boys at Bushranger Golf have a mission to outwit, outsmart and outdrink every bushranger that they come across.

They do it by running fun social events, where everybody has a laugh and the hackers who play to the best of their wide ranging abilities are the ones who walk away with the prizes!

When was the club established?

It started in 2004 among a group of friends and is now a growing on-line club that is open to all social golfers who enjoy having a hit and a laugh!

If you want to join Bushranger Golf you can just log on to www. bushrangergolf.com.au and fill in the electronic application and you're in. * It's so simple even I (Freddo) did it and it didn't hurt a bit – well, not yet anyway!

How did it start?

The founder of the club was Matt Pitt who invented a tournament called The Bushranger Cup so all his unorganised golfing friends would finally get organised and attend. Apparently the trophy was so impressive that the Bushrangers have kept coming back ever since. Last year, his new found Yankee friend Richard joined Matt and started Bushranger Golf, which is an official social group and event management business.

How many members do you have?

From the original 18 at the first event there are now over 100 registered "Bushrangers" who take to the links in their body armour. Although I hear that the outfits can get quite hot in summer, it has apparently largely reduced the requirement for members to yell out "fore" during a round!

Do you have fees or charges?

There is no joining fee at all and the club is currently looking to be set up through Golf Access to allocate official handicaps to their members (which will cost \$99 per year per member).

When do you play?

The boys say that they get out whenever the event has been

cleared via the War Department (wives and significant others). As most of the events are weekenders, some of the guys require a leave pass to make it to the first tee!

What prizes do you have?

There are some magnificent custom-designed Bushranger trophies that look like Ned Kelly having a swing at the old white pill. We also have other prizes such as various grades of alcohol, Bushranger branded golf balls and any other items we can lay our hands on.

What courses are you playing in 2006?

This year the club is playing at Growling Frog, Corowa, Eagle Ridge, Moonah Links, 13th Beach, Yarra Bend and possibly Barnbougle Dunes (Tassie).

What competitions do you play?

The majority of games are Ambrose (the social golfer's game of choice), with some occasional stableford events thrown in. The Bushranger Cup has the most profound and complex format in all of social club golf. It combines strokeplay, 2-ball and 4-ball Ambrose over a total of 72 holes of play. Apparently Matt and Richard had to borrow one of the super computers from NASA just to work out last year's results!

Do you have handicaps for players?

As advised, Bushranger Golf is looking to go to the Golf Access system for handicapping shortly. Currently players without real handicaps are assigned a social club handicap calculated by height, shoe size and something else!

Do you have sponsors?

We are sponsored by bwired (www.bwired.com.au) who are a website technology company (you just have to log on to the club's website www.bushrangergolf.com.au to see how well set up they are!) We also get some help from Pitt-Bull Media (www.pittbullmedia.com.au) with web content and maintenance.

Finally, our mighty trophies are designed and built by Focal Point Garden Designs.

Who is your best player?

On the course it's a toss up between Crotman Crocko Diddio, Doomsday Wall and Boo the Enigmatron. Off the course, it's gotta be Hungry, Hungry Willo who is a master at Texas Hold 'Em, Acey Deucy and any other game of chance! The best value player is the resident entertainer and raconteur Mickey Dee (see what's in my Bag) who brings a touch of class to this sometimes shabby group.



Who is your worst player?

Every member of this group is capable on his day of putting in a shocker, but the Shabby Lieutenant takes top honours here, not for being the worst, but just for just being the shabbiest!
